Background / Purpose

1. Attendees to Neighborhood Meetings feel “lost” when trying to understand development projects.
2. Direction provided to NA members depend entirely on the strength of the Land Use Chair for their neighborhood.
3. Resources online were unorganized, difficult to find, and incomplete.

In 2019, the former Council agreed to the goal of bettering Land Use Education for the Community, and devoted significant staff time/resources to assist with enhancing materials.

What is Land Use?

Land use is defined as what is built or developed, or what activities take place on, a piece of property. There are many moving parts to planning for land use in a City, and it can get quite complex!

The City's role in land use planning is to ensure that both public and private development are aligned with the standards set out in the City's guiding documents such as the Bend Comprehensive Plan, Zoning Map and Development Code. The community's role in land use is to advocate for appropriate development in their neighborhoods.

There are two ways that community members can participate in the land use process right here in Bend, and that is through ***Land Use Planning*** and ***Development***.

Key Points:

1. What can be built is defined in Zoning and the building code.
2. The public should be involved in the development and the updates to the development code.
3. Changes to a particular development project are **difficult** once the application has been submitted. Public may sway development approval for exceptions, waivers, and/or variances.

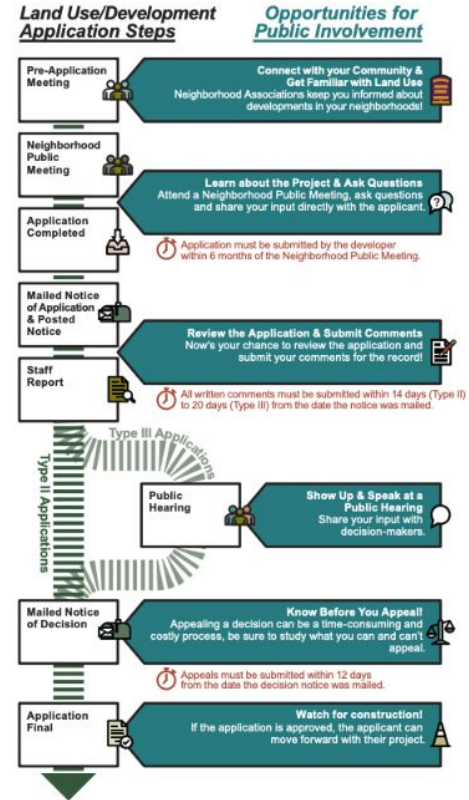

Interactive Mapping

The [Community Development Data Explorer](#) is a community-friendly interactive mapping tool that can be used to perform common search functions such as finding property zoning, getting information on land use applications, and accessing permit and licensing information for any tax lot within Bend city limits. Interactive Mapping – Development Activity Tracker

This is a great tool to allow you to filter projects by category, unity types, and/or neighborhood.

The **Development Activity Tracker** provides a real-time snapshot of development across the City of Bend. This dynamic and interactive mapping application allows you to explore all new construction permits that are either active or have been recently completed for both residential and commercial projects. *Data is updated nightly and is subject to change.*
